Were your grandparents from Japan? *My granny was, but grandpa was Chinese.*

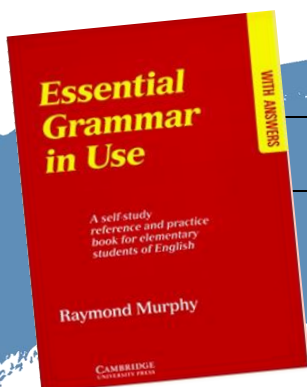
Was your last trip interesting? *Not really. It was exhausting! We were stuck at the airport for a long time.*
